## What is the E-Rate?

- Federal program to subsidize the cost of ~~telecommunications and Internet access~~ broadband to schools and libraries
- Applicants receive 20%-90% “discount” on costs for eligible services
- Not a competitive grant; all applicants receive some funding

## Focus on Broadband

- No reduction in eligibility of broadband services
  - Expansion of dark fiber/self-provisioned eligibility
- Voice services phased out: 20 percentage points per year
  - Includes circuits dedicated to voice
- Voice equipment removed
- Video services and equipment removed
- Other non-broadband services removed
  - E-mail
  - Webhosting
  - Voicemail

## Voice Funding Withering

Base Discount	2015-2016	2016-2017	2017-2018	2018-2019	2019-2020	Increased Cost 2015
20%	-	-	-	-	-	25%

## Priority 2 is now Category 2

- Voice, video and servers dropped
- Top discount dropped from 90% to 85%
- \$150-in-5 replaces 2-in-5 (\$2.30-in-5 for libraries)
- Caching added
- Managed internal broadband services added
- \$1 billion available next 2 years, then ?

## Simplifying? the Process, Part 1

- No tech plans
- Checks straight from USAC to applicants
  - No service provider certification of BEARs
  - Starting ~July 2016
    - You need to file a Form 498 first
- EPC (pronounced “epic”; E-Rate Productivity Center)
  - All forms must be filed through EPC
  - All communications (e.g., PIA) through EPC
  - Form 470 available now, others coming

## Simplifying? the Process, Part 2

- Discount calculation simplified
  - Urban/rural criteria changed
- New Item 21 Attachment format
  - May be possible to import last year's
- Contracts don't have to look like contracts; must be written
- New form for multi-year contracts ... later (don't use it)
- Must consider Preferred Master Contracts (maybe some day)
- No 470 for business-class Internet access (file anyway)
- Appeals must be filed with USAC first
- Documents must be retained for 10 years

## Fund Increased

- Fund capped at \$3.9 billion (instead of \$2.3 billion)
- Category 1 funding is assured for everyone
- Category 2 funding is likely to reach everyone in 2016-2017

## WANs: Going Over to the Dark Side

- You can “buy” a fiber WAN
  - Must compare price to lit fiber, regular bandwidth contract
- You can lease a dark fiber WAN built just for you
  - Must compare price to lit fiber, regular bandwidth contract
- You don't have to amortize upfront costs
  - Bill USAC up front for their share, but pay your share of upfront costs over 4 years
- If the state kicks in support for broadband, the E-Rate will match up to 10% (not in NJ; advocacy opportunity)

## How do I Get Dark Fiber?

- Start right away
  - Give bidders more than 28 days to create proposals
- Make a list of locations; map them
- How many strands?
  - Self-provisioned: 12 strands
  - Lease/IRU: whatever strands you'll light
- Do a little research on pole right-of-ways

## New C2 Services

- Caching
  - Web caching: commonly accessed pages stored locally
  - WAN caching: commonly accessed data stored locally
- Managed Internal Broadband Services (MIBS)
  - Operation, management, monitoring, repair of LAN
  - May include leased equipment
    - May include upfront charges
  - Ineligible components must be cost-allocated
  - Cloud WLAN controller charges

## C2 Services No Longer Eligible

- Voice equipment (PBX)
- Video equipment (Video server)
- Servers (DNS, DHCP, email)
- Antennas (excluding access points)
- Interfaces / Gateways (IAD, media converter)
- Circuit cards

## Category 2 Budgets

- Five-year budgets:
  - Schools: \$150/student
  - Libraries: \$2.30/sq.ft. (Urban libraries: \$5/sq.ft.)
  - \$9,200 minimum per location
- Spend it how you want:
  - all in 1 year, spread across 5 years, half this year and half next year, etc.
- Includes Basic Maintenance, MIBS
- Budget is per-location
  - Equipment which serves more than one location consumes budget from each location served
    - Based on tangible criteria, provide a realistic result
    - Examples: per user, per square foot, per location, other (e.g., by usage)

## What Should I Do?

- **Get on EPC now**
  - If you are considering dark fiber, contact Joe Freddoso, FCC fiber consultant: [jfreddoso@mightyriverllc.com](mailto:jfreddoso@mightyriverllc.com)
  - Spend C2 funding as soon as you can
  - Consider moving to internal VoIP if you own the phones
  - If you go MIBS, get a contract with large upfront costs, or buy equipment
  - Stop paying for cell phones directly: stipend

## How do I use EPC?

1. Activate an Account Administrator  
(creates users, assigns permissions)
2. Create user accounts
  - a) Assign permissions
3. Associate consulting company
  - a) Add users from consulting company
  - b) Assign permissions to consulting company
4. Get started on the Form 470
  - a) Save & Share to let others see the form

## The New Form 470

- Only through EPC
  - No paper form
- Saving: what the buttons mean
  - Save & Continue: save this page, go to next page
  - Back: save this page, go to previous page
  - Save Changes: just save, stay where you are
  - Save & Share: close form, make available to all users above Read Only permissions, who can then make changes
    - If another user “Accepts” the form to make changes, no one else can view it until that person hits “Save & Share”
- No opportunity to describe each service
- One narrative for all services per Category
  - Combined, narratives cannot exceed 5,000 characters

## Use “RFPs”

- “RFP” only means “additional information”
  - Does NOT mean what you think it means
- Prepare a description of services desired, then upload it to the 470
- Required for dark fiber
- Probably necessary for Category 2, for example:
  - Number and speed of switch ports
  - Which flavor of 802.11
